Mission Statement

In partnership with students, parents, and community, the CVMS staff will educate our children to be successful lifelong learners and productive citizens.

Principal's Highlights

At CVMS, we focus our attention on solid instructional practices and strive to encourage students to be life-long learners. Further, we are committed to using student data to inform instruction.

- Tutoring available to all students three afternoons per week, transportation provided two of the three afternoons.
- Co-teach classes in core subject areas across all grade level. Supervised computer lab and library access during lunches and advisory.
- Implemented 24/7 math remediation and enrichment opportunity via the school's website.

 Up-to-date access for parents to view student grades using the PowerSchool Parent Portal on the school's website.

 A total 60 minutes of advisory time is built into student schedules facilitating reading and remediation.

- Staff collaboration and/or professional development time is built into each week's schedule.

 College Boards Springboard curriculum in all English classrooms increase rigor and vertical alignment across each grade.
- Continual and thematic professional development topic includes Common Core content and Thinking Maps

Goals and Objectives

Increase math achievement by utilizing data to inform differentiated instructional practices within each class

We will increase CVMS's math PAC rate by 5% for all students and subpopulations. For subpopulations that do not meet the PAC rate an increase of 10% will be expected.

Increase ELA achievement by utilizing data to inform differentiated instructional practices within each class.

We will increase CVMS's ELA PAC rate by 5% for all students and subpopulations. For subpopulations that do not meet the PAC rate an increase of 10% will be expected.

Goal 3

CVMS will promote a more positive school climate and initiate an anti-bullying campaign.

Objective(s):

CVMS will promote a more positive school climate, as measured by the reduction of bullying, disrespect and aggressive behaviors school-year vs. school-year. The PowerSchool report "Discipline Summary Report" will be used to capture appropriate data.

School Communication Efforts

CVMS communicates with parents in several ways. The school website provides information about school activities, athletics, and other special events. Catalogs and student handbooks are accessible via the school website. Parents receive a monthly informational newsletter via U.S. mail and/or e-mail. Parents can access real-time grades and glimpse into the grade book of their student via the student accounting system. The parents of 7th grade students are invited to a "Back-To-School Day" before the start of school and all parents are encouraged to attend "Back-To-School Night." Further, the school calendar provides for a parent teacher conference day. The parents of 8th grade students met with counselors to receive specific information regarding the transition to the high school campus, graduation requirements, and to set goals for each student. In the spring, parents are asked to complete a survey with the intent to get constructive feedback regarding their thoughts about school safety, staff, and programs. A parent booster organization, which is open to all parents, meets monthly to discuss school needs.
